Ultimate Bookworm Challenge Guidelines

- The Ultimate Bookworm Challenge runs January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.
- Full participation is limited to Eagle Public Library cardholders. City of Eagle residents who do not have an Eagle Public Library card must obtain one to be eligible for the final prize. Cardholders from other libraries may participate in the challenge but will need to pay for the cost of the Ultimate Bookworm Challenge completion prize.
- One book per category, for a total of 50 books in 50 weeks. The categories may be completed in any order.
- Record the books you read in this reading log (or any log of your choosing). The Ultimate Bookworm Challenge Committee of Voracious Readers suggests that books be a minimum of 150 pages unless otherwise noted. Any type of book counts—a paper book, an ebook, or audiobook.
- Upon completion of the 50 challenges, contact the library (in-person, by email at eaglelibrary@cityofeagle.org, or by phone at 208-939-6814) to record your accomplishment and register for the prize. Report your completion of the 2024 Ultimate Bookworm Challenge by January 31, 2025, to be eligible for the completion prize. **No exceptions.**

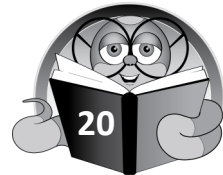
